



CCS HOSTS 2021 CHORAL CLINIC

CCS looks forward to hosting a choral clinic on Friday, January 22, with featured conductor, Mrs. Nikki Eoute. Choir students in grades 7 through 12 will benefit from the instruction and guidance of this seasoned choral instructor. A 2:05 p.m. program will end the day by allowing the students to share some of their hard work.

Mrs. Eoute lives in Greenville, South Carolina, with her husband and their four children. She holds a B.Mus and M.Mus in voice performance and an M.Mus in choral conducting performance.

She was an auditioned participant in the 2006 Westminster Choir College Summer Workshop studying choral music and conducting in Florence, Italy, with Dr. Joe Miller of Westminster Choir College, and in 2012 she was an auditioned singer for the first Northwestern Summer Music Institute with Dr. Steven Smith.

As a founding member of Rivertree Singers, a choral ensemble in the burgeoning South Carolina upstate arts scene, Mrs. Eoute has twice been featured in Piccolo Spoleto's Spotlight on Choral Music Series in Charleston, South Carolina. She served on the Rivertree Singers management team, working closely with director and mentor Warren Cook.

Mrs. Eoute has been a featured soloist in many choral concerts and choral recordings and has won several awards at the National Association of Teachers in Singing competitions in classical and musical theatre. She works closely with Dan Forrest and Beckenhorst Press. She was also selected as a soloist for Eric Whitacre's Virtual Choir 4 in 2013 and was considered to audition for the British choral ensemble Voces8. Nikki was the

Artistic Director and founder of the Greenville Youth Chorale.

She currently is an adjunct professor at Bob Jones University as a vocal teacher, coach, and choral conductor while maintaining a vocal and violin studio at home.

Science Seminar, 01/20-22



On Wednesday through Friday, 01/20-22, CCS students in grades 3 through 12 will enjoy exciting and educational science seminars with Dr. George Matzko.

Dr. Matzko travels and speaks on a variety of topics related to the Bible and Science in school science classes using engaging demonstrations. One of the most welcomed aspects of Dr. Matzko's ministry has been his willingness to answer Bible/science questions in open sessions that go beyond the creation/evolution category.

Dr. Matzko was a member of the science faculty at Bob Jones University from 1979 until he retired from the classroom in May 2018 and began his encore career as the BJU Science Ambassador in August 2018 along with his wife Darlene. He graduated from BJU with a degree in chemistry in 1973 and earned a PhD in analytical chemistry from Clemson University in 1978. He is a member of the American Chemical Society and the Creation Research Society. In addition to teaching chemistry and physics classes, Dr. Matzko pioneered a class called Science: Impact on Society that brought the Biblical worldview to bear on public policy and environmental issues.

For 32 years, George and his wife, Darlene, led summer mission teams to Nova Scotia (1981-1989) and Australia (1995-2017) where he regularly spoke on the Bible and science in churches, schools, and camps.

Dr. Matzko's commitment to a literal six-day creation carries an essential message that it's not science vs. Scripture, but science in Scripture that glorifies our Lord Jesus Christ and honors Him as the Creator.
